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Abstract—The purpose of this study was to determine if there were differences in the prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders among different types of workers. The study included 1000 male workers from three different industries: manufacturing, construction, and services. Data were collected through self-administered questionnaires. Results showed that the prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders was highest among manufacturing workers, followed by construction workers, and lowest among service workers. These findings suggest that certain work environments may pose higher risks for musculoskeletal problems.
