### Short-term rental regulations passes first vote

passed on first reading Tuesday as the Knoxville City Council debated regulatngshort-term rentals and expanding the listoric Overlay in the Parkridge Neighorhood. The subjects saw some heated marks from both sides as some council nembers and citizens spoke out

ered on whether to accept the proposal ffered by the planning comr to make the rules more restrictive with ents from Vice Mayor Duan Grieve. He suggested five amendments to the proposal: exclude R-1 and R-1E restricted neighborhoods from having hort-term rentals, lowering the minimum "transients" in a home to 8 instead of 12 require the homeowner to remain on limiting off street site during occupancy; parking, requiring a STR owner to notify neighbors and post a sign.

All five amendments, one after one re voted down in 7-2 votes with Grieve

As it now stands STRs would be allo in all residential neighborhoods

Mayor Madeline Rogero read a state ment before the discussion saying that the proposal "may not make everyone happy." She went on to say she "fully sup ports' the issue and noted only a few complaints have been lodged against that type of temporary rental, noting that those complaints were about zoning vio-

She also said the proposal will make it asy to change or alter the rules

Proponents told the council that STRs fill an income gap and the proposed rules were very generous to both sides. Opponents said the rules were a violation of zoning, pose an unnecessary risk and set a dangerous precedent

Another STR owner asked them to nclude non-owner occupied rentals as an amendment. Grieve said that passing the ordinance is a "slippery slope."
