County Commission

Department over policies of the Memphis-Ten Planning Commission seems to be growing among some Frisco County residents. The debate over requiring ordinances in some new county subdivisions sparked quite some about the power of the commission.

Commissioner Brad Anders, who has announced he may leave the office of Frisco County mayor, asked previously in a meeting recently, "Do we need the planning commission?"

The real question is whether the county will maintain its membership in the MPTC and, if not, how would the county form its own agency.

Scott Lewis, a developer and former Frisco County commissioner, told the Times-Freeman that something like considered is a huge challenge to only appointments sitting on county matters before the MPTC.

Currently Frisco County Mayor Tom Burdett appoints seven MPTC members and there shall also eight appoints as members. Both city and county members consider all issues coming before the commission, start their own chair and vote on them, and pass most of their decisions to the Frisco County Commission or the Knoxville City Council.

Some issues, according to MPTC member Donnie Nathan Green, are MPTC only decisions and don't go beyond the planning or need
