Open house tonight for Magnolia Avenue Streetscape Project

Construction gets underway next month on \$4.18 million first phase

City Engineering and ledevelopment staff will be there Monday to talk with stakeholders one on one. Also at this open house will be Vaughn and Melton, which is providing construction engineering and inspection al contractor. The Frank-

The first of the twohase streetscape project will make upgrades a section of Magnolia Avenue between Jessamine Street and Myrtle Street, Improvements will include landscaped center medi ans with designated left turn lanes, new stamped crosswalks, designated street parking, traffic signal upgrades, street trees and landscap-ing LED pedestrian and street lighting, and wider

Work will begin on the north side of Magnolia Avenue at Jessamine Street, and it will progress eastward to Myrti Street. Then, the work will Magnolia and move west One lane of traffic in

each direction will be maintained on Magno lia Avenue throughout the project, and pedes-trian access through the work zone - and access to businesses - will be maintained at all times.

A groundbreaking cer emony is scheduled for 10 a.m. on Thursday, Aug. 9, in front of the KAT employee parking lot at the northeast corner of Magnolia Avenue and ssamine Street. The first phase of the
