time it was in East Tennessee when the attack happened. The news of the attack took some time to reach the public across America and came as a huge shock to almost everyone. The United States entered World War II the next day. The Remembrance Day Service will be held in

the rotunda of the Veterans Cemetery, opening with a moment of silence. Anyone planning to attend should bring a camera as there will be lots of Pearl Harbor memorabilia on exhibit

The featured speaker will be Vice Admiral Ken-dall L. Card, former Deputy Chief of Naval Operations and the 64th Director of Naval Intelligence. He served from 1977 until 2013 and took part in Enduring Freedom, Southern Watch and Iraqi Freedom. Knoxville's Post 2 of the American Legion was
