

supporters seek help from commission

The Knox County mayor got an earful last week when supporters of affordable housing in South Knox County spoke before the county commission's work session.

Wanda Edwards of Knoxville said that the mayor didn't want them to attend a meeting on the project and that said that more than \$400,000 has already been spent on preparing the former athletic field at South Joyce Middle School for the stadium.

She added that the corporation had been promised three years of national stadium events which could have resulted in an investment return of about \$5 million.

"Six years of work and we want to be faced," Edwards said as Mayor Glenn Frazier walked
