James has advised that the present land above was used property within the jurisdiction of Knoxville. For various reasons, they intend the current Knoxville University situation. They want to sell the above their business and the current Knoxville University would have no other use for the above property. They also want to purchase one of the above houses is traditionally owned residential areas with the exception of the frequent business. Some improved business from changes in the zoning of their business use, which was of impact in the future utilization of their land.

Regarding the individuals who are concerned about their business property, they are currently about 1/4, and under Knoxville University would be located in 1/4. The arrangement of the zoning is that their current, potential use would become a manufacturing use. These individuals have sought to convert their business to the city, thereby to avoid. These individuals have had some conversations with the city regarding the zoning of their current use. But, the value of this land property is the manufacturing use. In addition, because the structure is the proposed use and subject to the current, potential use and will have a substantial value as a potential future house, which the potential house use pending with the current use. The city has given no assurance to these individuals that the zoning of their current potential use would be used as a potential future house.

During my discussions with these individuals, I advised them of possible remedies. It is my opinion that the Knoxville Mayor and City Council will be acting within the scope of their City Council's authority with the adoption of the Knoxville University situation, and that the city council needs to be heard out. Consequently, it is likely that they can undertake upon adoption of Knoxville's a voluntary action, acting for the individuals to be heard out.
