housing partners have invested more than \$236 million in the construction and renabilisation of affordable housing.

The City's investment of \$4.75 million has leveraged spending from other sources totaling more than \$189 million. These investments have resulted in the creation or rehabilitation of 4.502 units of affordable housing – 3,787 completed, with 715 additional units in the pipeline as of Sect. 1, 2019.

"Increasing the availability of affordable housing has been a priority of my administration," Mayor Rogero said. "Our Community Development staff works with public, private and nonprofit developers and maximizes the allocation of City funds by leveraging other public and onlytic sector oblists."

Mayor Rogero's administration and the City's partners have addressed the availability, accessibility and affordability of housing for low- to moderate-income households by investing
