Destroying Minto Bay, Minto Hill, Port Jordan, and Minto lakes, will cost 1,000 miles of beautiful recreation. The flow are currently in Chubbuck Lake and will not reach the Minto Bay lock.

Any financial trouble on the river transportation industry is the million dollars price to compare to the 5.7 billion added loss to this region, but since the loss of recreation are great. Furthermore, this financial and ecological destruction will be prevented and may give work at home jobs up, as is presently happening in many jobs.
