Johnson sale pass without comment

The fight is apparently over between opponents of selling the Andrew Johnson Building and moving the federal administrative offices to the Fisk Tower.

Both items were on the Knox County Commission's "consent" list, a long list of items that the commission votes on with one vote that vote. Both items ended up there after the work session the week before, after without as much as a vote. The commission met on Monday's Regular Commission meeting.

The school board's opposition to the move prompted the commission to approve their resolution. "Regarding the sale of the administrative offices from the Andrew Johnson Building to the Fisk Tower," the commission voted to pass a resolution.
