#### Master Sergeant Roddy Edmonds to be honored

The Knox County Commission has a resolution agreement with Knoxville wish Alliance to honor an East Tennes sean who saved more than 200 Ameri-Master Sergeant Rodrick (Roddy)

Edmonds was not a Jew but his action as a prisoner of war in a German prison camp in World War II were heroic and the corner of Market Street and Clinch Avenue will soon see a marker in his

imprisoned at Stalag IX. On a bitter cold January morning Edmonds, the highest ranking non-commissioned officer there, was ordered to assemble every arating the soldiers for "special treat-American

warned that, if captured, to remove the dog taga Edmonds ordered all 1.275 soldiers

to assemble outside and the German nmander was frustrated. Edmonds was told to identify the Jewish soldiers

We are all Jews here," Edmo replied. He said that if the Nazi wanted to shoot all the lews he would have to shoot all the soldiers. The German commander backed off and no one was separated or shot.

monds will be honored with a memori-al marker at the corner of Market Street and Clinch Avenue. The Knoxville native stood up to a German commander and saved at least 200 Jewish American

liberated the prison camp. Edmo returned home and never spoke of the incident and his actions were never rec gnized by the Army nor did he receive a medal Edmonds died in 1985 and was

uried with military honors. His son, Chris Edmonds, pastor of the Piney Grove Baptist Church in Maryville, began researching his father's history
