



## Two Jacobs officials on paid leave in theft investigation

Two Jacobs Engineering Group Inc. officials are on paid leave as the company investigates a theft of a laptop computer from its New York City office, according to a company spokesman. The theft occurred on Monday, June 1, 2010, and the laptop was valued at \$1,000. The company is currently investigating the theft and has not yet identified the suspect.
